



PROGRAMME BRIEF

About PLANE - Partnership for Learning for All in Nigeria (PLANE) is a nine-year education programme, funded by the UK Foreign, Commonwealth and Development Office (FCDO). The programme aims to support and realise the Government of Nigeria's commitment to deliver sustainable improvements in learning outcomes for all of Nigeria's children.

PLANE works with state and non-state actors to support the government in driving systemic reforms that strengthen basic education systems and promote inclusive, high-quality foundational learning. With a focus on marginalised groups –especially girls and children with disabilities, the programme aims to support the government to deliver effective, large-scale education services with the potential to transform learning outcomes nationwide.

Where We Work - PLANE works at the federal level, in the southwest region and in five states (Kaduna, Kano, Jigawa, Yobe and Borno) with legislators, state and non-state education providers, civil society organisations, teachers' union, community leaders, learners and parents.

All of Nigeria's children deserve access to a high-quality education system that gives them the skills they need to build a brighter and more prosperous future.

PLANE's Mission is to bring about sustainable improvements in learning outcomes. PLANE seeks to achieve this mission through supporting the government to drive systemic reforms that: strengthen teaching and learning with a focus on foundational skills; address governance bottlenecks to improve education service delivery; enhance regulation of the non-state sector; embed the use of data and evidence in decision-making; support the education of children affected by conflict; engage with community structures; and advance the inclusion and learning of marginalised children across the system.

What We Do - The programme's scope extends across three strategic windows of intervention, namely foundational skills development (led by DAI and consortium partners), education in emergency situations (led by UNICEF), and community-centred initiatives (led by Save the Children). It is supported by the DELVe evidence, learning and accountability function.
